Thirdly, Deb has taken the overall music ministry and worship experience at Sampson's Mills to a new level. Her amazing skills as an organist and pianist have glorified the Lord through music each Sunday morning for many years. When Sampson's Mills was without a Pastor, Deb created new and unique orders of worship for those Sundays. She encouraged individuals within the congregation to share their gifts and talents during the summer months and during special services and also directed many memorable choral presentations for Christmas and Lent. Deb has also enriched others with the gift of friendship during her tenure at the church. On behalf of Sampson's Mills, we greatly appreciate all that you have done. You will truly be missed!

On a more personal level, I am so thankful to have had the privilege of working with Deb in our music ministries. From the beginning, Deb helped me to expand my abilities as a singer and as a handbell ringer. I never had the confidence to sing solos or duets or trios or quartets, however with Deb's encouragement I thoroughly enjoy it now. There was never a time that Deb said we couldn't do something. I remember when I first rejoined the choir after taking time off from church because of my work schedule. I was incredibly shy then and was even somewhat intimidated by Deb when I

first met her. I came from a time when the choir had a "pick a note, any note" mentality, but Deb expected us to sing the correct notes and rhythms written for our parts. It took some getting used to, but she has definitely made me a better, more confident singer. I remember when I sang my first solo; it was for the July 4th weekend and I was so scared. However, I knew that Deb would cover for me if I messed up. There were many times that I messed up a solo handbell piece, but Deb would help me recover every time. Through the years we have done many new and exciting things together like singing in a huge choir for the 2012 General Assembly, playing handbell solos and duets, performing in the Mystery dinner theatre, creating Maundy Thursday and Good Friday services, attending the Western Handbell Festival, and the list goes on. What I think I'm most grateful Deb's friendship. I am so lucky to call her a friend and I thank God and Sampson's Mills for bringing this amazing person into my life. I will truly miss having her as our choir and handbell director, but I know that our friendship will continue through the years. Thank you Deb, for making me what I am today.

I would also like to give a huge thank you and shout out to Bob Levkus and the Fellowship Ministry Team for the incredible farewell dinner for Deb. Great job!


