Members and Friends of Sampson's Mills Church,

After a year of retirement, I sensed God preparing me to begin an

interim ministry position. I lived with the idea for a season and asked myself these essential questions: Do I have room in my heart for a

congregation? Am I ready to serve with energy, intelligence, imagination and love (one of my ordination vows)? Am I ready to relinquish my fully retired schedule for a part-time ministry schedule? Am I prepared to address any significant issues that may emerge?

In my conversations with God, the answer to all those questions was an unqualified "yes".

As I considered several church positions, I learned that you would be looking for an interim pastor. I waited for your information to be posted on the Presbytery website. When I read your posting, I thought we were a good match.

First, I viewed your worship online for several weeks. I was impressed with Jessica's energy in her preaching, how she shared Scripture's practical implications for daily life, and how she clearly loves you all. A strong connection with your worship encouraged me.

Next was your congregation's ministry in your community. Events like welcoming children and their parents on Halloween, the community Vacation Bible School at the White Oak Park, and the Food Bank ministry reveal your heart for your neighbors and your faithfulness to Jesus' call "As the Father sent me, so I send you." Also, your midweek EPIC program and children's messages in worship reveal your commitment to the children and youth of your congregation.

All those initial impressions were confirmed as I met with your Personnel Team, your Session members and your staff. I think that we will make a good team during this transitional period.

In addition to normal pastoral tasks Session has established two priorities for the coming months: planning for your 125th anniversary celebration in 2025 and living into your Matthew 25 commitment - a national Presbyterian Church U.S.A. program that focuses on congregational vitality, poverty and issues of race. I look forward to working with the elders and other church leaders on these important priorities.

I look forward to meeting each of you and to getting to know you. While my position is part-time, I will do my best to support you and your family. With the **Spirit's help, our time together will honor God,** nurture your faith, and continue to bless your community.

A little more about Steve...

Steve was born and raised in Alton, Illinois. He received a Bachelor of Arts degree in mathematics and psychology from Blackburn College, Carlinville, Illinois (1979). He received a Master of Divinity degree from Princeton Theological Seminary (1982) and a Doctor of Ministry degree from Pittsburgh Theological Seminary (2000) where his thesis was "John Calvin and the Making of the Pastoral Mind".



Steve began ministry serving the Mountaintop Larger Parish, 3 small churches in rural Clear-field County, Pennsylvania (1982-1988). Steve served 35 years in Oakmont, Pennsylvania. He served 4 years at the Riverside Presbyterian Church and became the organizing pastor three months after the Riverside and First United Presbyterian Churches in Oakmont merged.

Steve has been active in Pittsburgh Presbytery since coming into the presbytery in 1988. Formerly, he served on an executive presbytery search team. He chaired the Presbytery's Evangelism and Congregational Development Unit and the Presbytery's Personnel Committee. Steve currently serves on the Presbytery's Commission on Ministry which supports congregations and pastors, and promotes peace and harmony in churches.

Steve and his wife, Diane, live in Natrona Heights, Pennsylvania. Diane is a music minister at **St. Richard's Church in Gibsonia. Their blended family consists of four sons, three daughters**-in-law, four grandsons and two granddaughters. Steve enjoys riding bicycles with Diane, reading, writing poems and working occasionally at his son's dog daycare in Verona.

May your longing and expectation bring you to encounter Jesus this Advent and Christmas season!



Children's Worship and Nursery Care In the new year, Children's Worship will revisit the format of "Godly Play". Previously used at SMPC, the current generation of our little ones have not yet gotten to experience this curriculum of spiritual practice. Godly Play practice teaches us to listen for God and to make authentic and creative responses to God's call in our lives. Our volunteers will be undergoing a training session in early January to fully implement this creative approach – one that nurtures participants' beliefs and faith through wondering and play.

Children age 4 through 4th grade are invited upstairs following Small Talk and will come back down to the sanctuary at the end of the service. Children age 3 and under are welcome in the Nursery at any time on a Sunday morning. On Communion Sundays we invite all of God's children to remain in the sanctuary so we can all celebrate communion together.


