Bless This Lent

40 Days to Reflect, Pray, and Bless our Imperfect Lives



Lent is a time for us to wrestle with the fullness of who we are as humans – fragile and frail, broken and dusty. It is also a time to wrestle with the fullness of who God is – the one who sits and takes on the dust and makes beautiful things out of it, including us. It mirrors Jesus' own journey in the wilderness, whereby we, too, make our way into the thick of gospel narrative that will inexorably and invariably lead to the cross.

This year, we will draw inspiration from Kate Bowler and Jessica Richie's book *The Lives We Actually Have: 100 Blessings for Imperfect Day* for our Lenten journey with each other and with Jesus. Kate Bowler writes "Lent is an incredible moment for the spiritual honesty we are practicing here. Together, we're going to bless the days we have, while longing for the future God promised when there will be no tears, no pain, no email." Each week we look at what might be a peculiar blessing, but in the vein of the blessings Jesus offered in the Beatitudes. Examples include blessings for the imperfect, the curious, the suffering ones, the lonely and more.

We are providing a variety of ways to enter into this Blessed Lent season and these odd and wonderous blessing for our imperfect lives. Devotionals will be provided. Although there will be a few printed versions available at request, we invite you to utilize the online option as each day features supplemental links to scripture, music and podcasts. Worship will incorporate these blessings as part of our pastoral prayers, as well as unpacked in our weekly sermons.

I invite you to begin Lent with our Ash Wednesday worship on February 22nd at 7pm, where we will remember that we are dust and to dust we will return but also the promise that God goes with us in our all our dusty-ness. Simple, meditative music will draw us in to this holy day of penitence and forgiveness. Offering our broken pieces in a prayer station followed by the imposition of ashes will complete our service.

As we journey later in the season to palm, passion and the empty tomb, we will celebrate the climax of the Jesus story with the

What is Faith Formation?

What is Faith Formation? And how is it different than Christian Education? Within the last couple of years, our Christian Education Team has adopted the new name of "Faith Formation Team"...and with good reason.

Faith is not learned like math or science. Faith is not blindly reciting Bible verses or memorizing the books of the Bible in order. True faith in God is a way of life and it is only acquired through experience. Faith is developed over time and at a different pace for everyone. Faith is learning who you are and to whom you belong. Faith is living in the kingdom of God right here on earth.

So how do we "teach" faith at Sampson's Mills? We start how Jesus did: by meeting people where they are. At Sampson's Mills, we welcome everyone. Yes, EVERYONE. We provide a warm, welcoming environment that aims to show the worshipper that they belong to God and are safe to explore and grow their faith with us.

When an adult enters our sanctuary or joins us online, they bring with them a variety of past church experiences. Our job is to simply be a place of hospitality and love. When a teenager joins us, they also bring experiences, memories, and perceptions. But what about children? What about our youngest brothers and sisters in Christ who have had little to no church experience yet?

We are very intentional with how we encourage Faith Formation with our youngest worshippers. On a weekly basis, we provide coloring and activity sheets that correspond with the sermon theme. These pages are available while the kids are in the pews and are also available on our website for those worshipping online. Then during Small Talk, we talk about the scripture in a new and creative way that is geared to their age. On most Sundays, the kids then go upstairs for Children's Worship, where they have a lesson and activity that helps them grow in their faith. These routine things are intended to help children feel welcome and wanted at Sampson's Mills every week.

Aside from our weekly provisions for children, we also are very intentional with their experience of the sacraments and special occasions within the church. They get a front row seat when we have a baptism because we want to show them what baptism looks like and means. We also intentionally keep them downstairs for the whole service when we share in communion. There is no requirement for taking communion. Pastor Jessica explains each time what the rituals mean and welcomes *everyone* to the table of grace. As children experience communion over and over again, they learn and feel the

that communion isn't about us qualifying to partake...
because none of us ever will...but it is about accepting the love God has for us and appreciating the grace bestowed upon us time and time again.


As our children got older, they go through confirmation class.

start to see their own responsibility in the kingdom of God and how God can and will use them. Once confirmed, our kids get an opportunity to be on the other side of that communion plate. They can now serve communion and immerse themselves in the experience of sharing God's grace with their church family. This is a really beautiful experience and transition.

Our kids and teenagers are also welcome to take part as worship leaders in many other capacities. Some like to be greeters, some like to collect offering, some sing in the choir, some hold the communion cup baskets, some read liturgy, and some even get involved with the technological end of worship by running power point, sound, and livestream. All of these opportunities help children and teens realize that there IS a place for them at church and that Sampson's Mills will continue to be their welcoming home as they grow. The more we, as adults, can do to encourage our young worshippers in their faith journey and church experience, the richer it will be. I encourage you to pay attention to what God is doing through our young people. If they continue to feel welcome and comfortable at Sampson's Mills, we have a very bright future ahead!


