SMPC began in 1892 (during President William McKinley's time!) as a simple Mission Sunday School. Participation grew and grew...so that in 1900, the church formally organized as Sampson's Mills Presbyterian Church. The mill stone, or grist stone, at the front of our church harkens back to the old Sampson mill work, which was an early meeting place of the Sunday school.

Please note that our membership today benefits from the many, many dedicated members who preceded us and demonstrated to the younger members (at the time) the example of stewardship, faithfulness, and missionary focus that we continue today. The church now serves a much wider membership that extends beyond White Oak to McKeesport, North Huntingdon, North Versailles and more.

We are excited to kick off the celebration of 125 years of service with our membership and the surrounding communities. In the coming months, you'll be hearing about a myriad of ways that we can celebrate our amazing history. There will be something for everyone and we thank you in advance for your input and participation in marking how we've been Loving our Neighbors since 1900.




