I am not sure what it is for you that gets you in that Advent and Christmas spirit. Perhaps it is when Starbucks gets out those red cups, or maybe its the neighborhood light up night. My brother-in-law's family has set up their own holiday to mark the start of the Christmas season. It is the day in November on which it is now permissible to stream Christmas music.

For me, it is taking my nativities out of their boxes. Unwrapping all the usual suspect characters. Mary and Joseph. Baby Jesus - well, he goes in the drawer for awhile until Christmas Eve. The shepherds and the wisemen. The ox and the sheep and the donkey. These nativities represent so much to me. Gifts from loved ones. The first one Andy and I bought. It was from Big Lots because that's all we could afford that first Christmas. They each tell a bit about the time in our family's life when they came into our home: Seminary. Our first church. The move back home to Pittsburgh. Some of them are a bit worn. A few characters are a bit broken. Evidence of real life moving, toddlers ,and the dog's tail.

This Advent we will draw close to the nativity season but in an unlikely way. Usually, like when unboxing our porcelain ones, we seek the point of view of the main characters. We dwell a bit on Joseph and his moral guandary regarding what to do about Mary. We draw near to Mary and God's invitation to birth God's love into the world. We hear the angel announcements and encouragements to the holy parents, setting them up to participate in humanity's redemption.

But what about the lesser characters? What about the folks in the Christmas story who don't even get a cameo in our home's nativity? Perhaps, this Advent, we can give them our due.

Using Rachel Billups' book, An Unlikely Advent, we will experience the Christmas story through the lenses of the more peripheral characters and even one who is downright antagonistic. We'll spend time with Zechariah and Elizabeth the first Sunday in Advent. A bit off our normal departure when we usually cozy up the riverbanks to hear their son, John's, voice crying out in the wilderness. The next week, we will slink our way into the halls of power and see things from Herod's point of view. The following week our All Church Pageant will explore the curious visitors from the East. Indeed, unlikely guests that behold Jesus' birth. The final week, we will take to the hills and catch the shepherd's witness of all that has taken place in the city below.

The hope is that we might just see the Christmas story a bit differently. We may also see ourselves in the stories of these lesser-known characters. Perhaps, finding that we, too, are invited into the nativity scene. That we also have a place near the manger bed.

So, how can you get started on your Unlikely Advent journey? Each Sunday we will **hear these characters' stories in worship. You can also opt into receiving our online** devotional that will come to your email each morning with a little bit of scripture and some selections from the book, *An Unlikely Advent*. If you would like the full experience, pick up the book to read along, with your family or with the Wednesday morning Bible Study group.

May we all have an Unlikely Advent!



Liturgists Needed!



Our ministry cannot move forward with God's plan for us without your help, for which we are SO thankful. This year has been filled with donations through monetary means, food drives and individual gifts, and volunteering time.

Now that we are nearing the year's end, we need that something extra so that everyone can experience the Joy.

Monetary donations not only help us to fund our monthly distributions of meat, dairy and produce, but also help us to provide gift cards to supplement our families' holiday meals. This allows each family to continue whatever holiday meal tradition they may have, be it ham, turkey or otherwise, and not be limited to the offerings of


